

- ~ Plastic Lumber
- ~ Carpeting
- ~Insulation
- ~Compost and many more ...


The village uses the facilities of the Ulster County Resource Recovery Agency. This guideline is adapted with permission and meets their 2005 requirements.

CARDBOARD


YES: Clean, flattened corrugated boxes.



NO: Soiled or stained boxes (such as pizza boxes).



NEWS/MIXED PAPER



YES: Mail including magazines, "junk" mail (windows are OK), fax paper, manila folders, food boxes, wrapping paper, books (please remove hard covers), phone books.

YES: Newspapers with glossy inserts are OK. Junk mail, incl. catalogues.
NO: Plastic materials.



Tie cardboard, tie or paper-bag other paper.

NO: metal objects such as staples or paper clips.

NO: milk or juice boxes from wet foods such as take out, ice cream or frozen foods.

COMMINGLED

Cans, glass and plastic may be placed together in one recycling bin after they have been rinsed clean.

GLASS:

YES: All colored and clear bottles and jars.

NO: Window panes or ceramics.



METAL AND ALUMINUM:

YES: Tin and aluminum food and beverage cans, metal jar lids and aerosol cans (caps removed).

NO: Scrap metal, license plates, pie tins, aluminum foil.



PLASTIC:

YES: Clean bottles and jugs, #1 and #2 plastic.

NO: Plastic lids, caps, wide mouth containers i.e., margarine tubs or yogurt cups.



NO microwave trays, styrofoam, toys, pesticide containers or automotive oil-based products. **NO** plastic bags, string or foreign materials.

Labels are OK to leave on but please rinse and remove all food particles from containers.
