



## ***VIBRANT VILLAGE POST SPRING 2013***



1. Street sweeping will begin in late April, weather permitting. Please sweep sidewalk/lawn edge sand into the street. Please do not push sand into piles, the sweeper is not designed for mounds of materials.
2. NEW – Brush Pickup system, the Village will do the Spring pick up in April and now be picking up brush every other Monday from April through November, on garbage days. Brush includes yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, plant materials and tree limbs less than 8” in diameter. **Brush will not include tree trunks or stumps, nor any garbage, building materials or construction debris. No extra fee is required.** The old brush landfill is being discontinued to prep for a water production project there.
3. A reminder to change batteries in your smoke detectors. Carbon Monoxide Detectors are now mandatory so make sure you have a properly working detector installed to keep you and your family protected.
4. The Village of Red Hook’s Annual Drinking Water Quality Report for 2012 has been completed and is available for viewing on the Village Hall’s Bulletin Board and on the Village website ([www.redhooknyvillage.org](http://www.redhooknyvillage.org)).
5. A swearing in ceremony will be held on April 8th, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. at the Village Hall for our newly elected officials. Congratulations to Village Trustee Jen Norris and Village Trustee Steve Zacharzuk.

We are often asked, **“When is the best time for pruning trees?”** It mostly depends on why you are pruning. Pruning during winter when trees are dormant results in a vigorous burst of new growth in the spring. Pruning trees in the summer reduces vigor. Prune spring flowering trees in the spring after blossoms fade. But fall pruning....don't do it!

## RESOURCE RECOVERY NEWS

13. Reminder – the Village of Red Hook is now doing single stream recycling. All recyclables (paper, comingled and newspaper) can now be placed together in a proper plastic container for pick up. Recycling is free with the purchase of garbage tags. ***Please do not over fill containers.*** Tags are on sale at Village Hall from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and always at Red Hook Natural Foods and Mac's Agway.

Frequently Asked Questions about Red Hook Village Resource Recovery:

- Q: Why should I use Village Garbage? I can put so much more garbage in a big private hauler.  
A: Village Garbage is a much better deal than private haulers. Blue tickets, which are for kitchen sized bags, are \$2.50, and red tickets, for black contractor bags, are \$5.00. A typical company costs about \$40 a month. Most families can get away with one blue tag per week—that's only \$10 a month for garbage and recycling! Even using one large red tag per week, a family can save \$20 per month—that's \$240 a year!!!

Not only does Village Garbage help your wallet directly, it helps with the big picture. The Village owns its own garbage and recycling trucks, and we employ our own highway department. These are costs that we incur throughout the year. The best way to offset these costs is to sell our garbage tickets. The more tickets we sell, the less the costs have to be taken from other sources, like taxes.

- Q: I like my private hauler. I can put all my recycling in one bin.  
A: You can do that with Village Garbage too! We now have single stream recycling, which means all your recycling can go into one bin—no more sorting! We only ask that the bins not be overloaded, but you can put out as many bins as you need.
- Q: OK, that sounds good, but I work during the week and can't buy tags at the Village Hall. What can I do?  
A: Aside from buying tags at the Village Hall during our office hours from 9-4, you can also purchase tags at Mac's Agway and the Red Hook Health Food Store, both of which are open on nights and weekends.
- Q: When is garbage pickup?  
A: Monday morning at 6:00 a.m. You can put your garbage and recycling bins out any time after 6:00 p.m. Sunday evening.
